

## Summer Pell Grant Policy

### Summer Pell Grant Policy 2010 and Moving Forward in 2011

For summer 2010, we will pay students their remaining eligibility first, if any, for 09/10, based on enrollment status. If the student's enrollment exceeds their remaining eligibility, we will pay the balance as the "second accelerated Pell" for 09/10, providing the student is enrolled at least ½ time.

Beginning in the summer semester, 2011, we will review student FAFSA results for both the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 academic years in order to determine which year will result in the highest Pell Grant award for the summer. All regular Satisfactory Academic Progress Policies and R2T4/withdrawal policies still apply for all the summer terms.

In order to receive an additional summer disbursement over and above 100% of the current year Pell Grant, a student must have completed 24 units (current attempted units are acceptable towards the 24 units). For example, summer enrollment can be attributed to the 24 units. In order for a student to receive additional Pell, they must be enrolled in at least 6 units (half-time) to receive additional Pell.

#### Policy for a Second Pell Grant Award during Summer as a crossover term

Students interested in accelerating their program and who meet all of the criteria listed above may be considered for summer Pell.
