The Certificate of Achievement in Esthetician is designed to exceed minimum California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology standards. Students will experience a combination of lecture and laboratory instruction covering

various topics such as manual, electrical and chemical facials. Proficiencies to be developed include principles of sanitation, client management as well as laws and administrative regulations. Courses are offered on an open enrollment basis and students may enroll at any time. Students are required to purchase a basic cosmetology kit.

2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

SCC has offered the Esthetician program since 1997. To align with the standard contact hour formula, we are updating the program units from 13 to 21. This accounts for lecture and lab hours, and takes the program from a locally approved skills certificate, to a certificate of achievement. No other changes have been made to the program besides updating the unit formula, splitting out Health & Safety, and adding the certificate. The program has the same 600 hours of curriculum aligned with the CA Board of Barbering & Cosmetology. Thank you for your review.

3. Summarize the Labor Market Information (LMI) and employment outlook (including citation for the source of the data) for students exiting the program. (See PCAH pp. 85-88, 136, 147, 148, 165, 168, and 176)

The Esthetician program prepares students as Skincare Specialists (39-5094), who may own their own business, work in a retail establishment, or skincare facility.

The median wage for Skin Care Specialists in Orange County is \$30,908 annually, or \$14.86 hourly. These wages do not reflect those self-employed, who would have a higher earnings potential.

In Orange County, jobs for Skin Care Specialists are expected to increase by 13.4%, or 166 jobs between 2014-2017, with 55 annual openings. Currently, there are 6 programs in LA/OC, of which 3 programs are in OC. Completions in OC average 40 students annually, with 15 net openings.
