II.c. Chancellor's Office Update

J. Wagner reported on the Regional Curriculum meeting attended on Saturday, November 18, 2017. A presentation was made that covered issues with COCI and how the issues will be addressed. AB705 was discussed with a timeline expected to be out by the end of the year. Discussion was encouraged.

L. Aguilera reported that the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) Curriculum Committee recommends that California community colleges not to make any changes as of a result of the CSU Executive Order 1100 to existing mathematics courses with an intermediate algebra prerequisite as these courses may lose articulation with other institutions that require the prerequisite. UCs have not moved towards implementing the same policy change as the CSUs.

L. Aguilera recommended that communication courses listed as CORE on the Communication Studies Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) not be offered 100% online. The C-ID descriptor requests that faculty evaluate speech presentations in front of a live audience.
