Resolution S2015.4

Affirmation of Participatory Governance in All RSCCD Programs

Moved: Professor Mettler

Seconded: Professor Taylor

Whereas, The Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College values honesty, cooperation, and collegiality between the Academic Senate, the Chancellor, and the RSCCD Board of Trustees as advocated by AB 1725, the ideals of participatory governance, and, more generally, the benefits that come from a collegial atmosphere;

Whereas, The Chancellor, in conjunction with the RSCCD Foundation, has merely reported his intentions to enter into an agreement with Technical Colleges in Saudi Arabia to the SCC and SAC Academic Senate Presidents without allowing for discussion within the governance framework;

Whereas, it has been determined in 10+1 that the Board of Trustees will come to mutual agreement with the Academic Senate for (1) Educational program development; and (2) District and College governance structures, as related to faculty roles;

Whereas, The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) has given Santiago Canyon College several recommendations that need to be addressed in a follow up report that include such recommendations as “the college establish formal systematic measures for periodically assessing, evaluating, and modifying its integrated planning and resource allocation process at both the college and district” (Recommendation 2) and that “the college design and implement regular and frequent evaluation process for governance, with the results informing planning and action” (Recommendation 4);

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College directs the Academic Senate President to express to the Chancellor and the RSCCD Board of Trustees the Academic Senate’s concern that the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College was not a part of the educational program development process;
