### **Support of Exploring a Potential Dual Enrollment Agreement between Santiago Canyon College and Unity Middle College High School**

Whereas, Santiago Canyon College (SCC) is an innovative learning community dedicated to intellectual and personal growth, seeking to form pathways and relationships to secure the success of our students and our institution;

Whereas, Unity Middle College High School (Unity MCHS) is seeking to forge a partnership with Santiago Canyon College, providing Unity MCHS students with an innovative dual enrollment opportunity at SCC to help with the intellectual and personal growth of our community;

Whereas, Assembly Bill 288 (recently approved by the Governor of CA) encourages governing bodies of community college school districts to expand dual enrollment opportunities for high school students who may not already be college-bound as well as to those who have been historically underrepresented in higher education; and

Whereas, The formation of such an agreement under AB 288 would be intended to create a seamless pathway between a high school and community college for career-technical education as well as for transfer, to improve graduation rates and degree goal completion, and to help high school students achieve vital skills for college and career readiness;

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College support the forging of a partnership between Santiago Canyon College and Unity Middle College High School to further the success of students in our community.
