Creation of a Joint Learning Management System Transition Task Force with Santa Ana College for the Blackboard to Canvas Conversion Process Handbook Description

Moved: Professor Taylor

Seconded: Professor Dela Cusack

Whereas, It is necessary to have discussions on the potential issues with converting from our current Learning Management System (LMS) Blackboard to the new LMS Canvas; and

Whereas, Discussions will include, but are not limited to, resources for faculty and staff, instructional design support, a plan for budgeting the cost savings, a timeline for the transition, and Informational Technology Systems (ITS) support; and

Whereas, The Academic Senate of California Community Colleges urge local senates and bargaining units to work with their administration to ensure that any monetary savings which may result from a district or college transitioning to a Common Course Management System (CCMS) be used primarily to support the professional development needs of distance education faculty making the transition to the new CCMS;

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College, in collaboration with the Academic Senate of Santa Ana College, create a joint Learning Management System Transition Task Force to facilitate the conversion from Blackboard to Canvas.

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College recommends that the savings incurred by Rancho Santiago Canyon College District in moving from Blackboard to Canvas flow to the colleges in accordance with the budget allocation model and be used for implementation, support and ongoing improvement of our online educational offerings, so long as such savings exist.
