## Resolution S2018.03

### Support for Committing to Exploration in the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program for One Year

Whereas, The Faculty of Santiago Canyon College is steadfast in support of the California Community College system mission in that Santiago Canyon College shall be a place of learning for every Santiago Canyon College student, regardless of students' educational goals; and

Whereas, The Faculty of Santiago Canyon College upholds the college mission of "Santiago Canyon College is an innovative learning community dedicated to intellectual and personal growth. Our purpose is to foster student success and to help students achieve these core outcomes: to learn, to act, to communicate and to think critically. We are committed to maintaining standards of excellence and providing the following to our diverse community: courses, certificates, and degrees that are accessible, applicable, and engaging";

Whereas, Currently, there are more unknowns than knowns regarding the proposed California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program; and

Whereas, The Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College has procedures regarding faculty participation in grants and state-wide initiatives;

Resolved, That the Faculty of Santiago Canyon College commits to a single year of open, formal exploration into the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program;

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College leadership will include recommendations from faculty throughout the college (such as Student Services [like TRIO, EOPS, & SSSP], equity, signature programs [like Honors, MUN, & Forensics], and Basic Skills) into any Santiago Canyon College Guided Pathways plan, which includes funding oversight and dispersion of funds, for Santiago Canyon College;

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Resolved, That any planned pathways related to Santiago Canyon College and the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program will go through the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College for formal faculty affirmation per the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College formal resolution process;

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College seeks guidance from faculty college-wide regarding an evaluation of Santiago Canyon College's one-year participation in the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program; and

Resolved, That well before State deadlines for any possible future involvement in the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program that the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College engage in the resolution process to determine whether faculty want to discontinue participation (as the State allows) or to continue participation in the California Community Colleges Guided Pathways Program.
