Extension of Remote Teaching Certification for Fall 2022

Moved: Senator Gonzalez

Seconded: Senator Castellanos

Whereas, The COVID-19 Pandemic forced all face-to-face instruction to shift into an online environment beginning in March 2020;

Whereas, Many face-to-face classes were converted to synchronous lectures (now called Online Live), using Zoom, to make the experience similar to face-to-face instruction for both faculty and students;

Whereas, Online live courses will continue to be offered during Fall 2022 and faculty must be trained in order to teach any type of distance education course and all current faculty have already completed at least the Remote Teaching Certificate (RTC) that allows them to teach courses using Online Live; and

Whereas, Santiago Canyon and Santa Ana Colleges are still actively discussing what training should be required for faculty teaching Online Live courses outside of an emergency;

Resolved, The Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College approve an extension of the Remote Training Certification (RTC) as the required training for faculty teaching a course offered as Online Live through the end of the Fall 2022 semester.
