Adoption of the Revised Plan A Associate Degree General Education “Reading Proficiency” (graduation petition code G:G2) Policy

Moved: Professor Diaz

Seconded: Professor Frost

Whereas, The SCC Curriculum and Instruction Council discussed the proposed revisions in spring of 2019 in consultation with Santa Ana College;

Whereas, The proposed policy revisions addresses students earning an Associate Degree, Plan A, and meeting the reading proficiency;

Whereas, The proposed policy revisions are to comply with AB 705;

Whereas, The requirements for the proficiency were chosen after the SCC Curriculum and Instruction Council had robust discussions regarding all possibilities for satisfying the proficiency since December 3, 2018;

Whereas, The SCC Curriculum and Instruction Council voted on March 18, 2019 to accept the proposed revision; and

Whereas, Since the reading placement exam is no longer a mechanism for placing students after November 1, 2018, the revisions are implemented immediately and the SCC 2018/19 catalog addendum will include revisions;

Resolved, That the Academic Senate of Santiago Canyon College adopt the revised Plan A Associate Degree General Education “Reading Proficiency” (graduation petition code G:G2) policy.
