I. SCC Student Conduct Training Survey Results & Next Steps (Fall/Spring)	Discussion	<p>One hundred forty seven employees responded to the survey. The committee reviewed the responses and made the following observations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Majority were interested in learning more about the student conduct process, followed by mental health and wellness. Question 2 was “select all that apply” which may have skewed the results. • Several respondents did not know what BIT and CARE Teams are. • Recommendation to organize responses and comments in clusters by role and interest to further analyze the responses and assess the best time for trainings. • The current online environment appears to have an impact on the results. <p>Discussion followed regarding next steps and ideas for trainings:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create an online presence for employees to easily access information. • Use multiple modalities to conduct trainings (online, webinars, PowerPoint presentations, Zoom meetings, in person, FLEX week, department meetings) • Presentations need to include time for participants to ask questions. 	

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offer trainings via Zoom on four consecutive Fridays and focus on a different topic each week or schedule a different training topic each month in the order of interest. • Tailor trainings to the current environment, such as mental health and COVID-19. • Reach out to the District to conduct Title IX and BIT & CARE team trainings. <p>It was suggested to create a focus group to organize the data and present to committee during FLEX week.</p>
