

## 10th Anniversary Celebration

On Wednesday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Library celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the current Library building. By answering the question, "If money were no object, what would you buy for the Library?," two hundred and ninety-three students received a free ticket to either a bakery or pizza food truck. Their responses were innovative and outside the box. ## Core Concept Video Collection

In spring 2017, six library instruction videos were added to the library website, enhancing our digital presence and furthering our goal of offering comprehensive access to learning support services for all students. Feedback from campus faculty members has resulted in the addition of two new library workshops.

*Creating Citations (Chicago/Turabian)* joins a schedule that already includes *Creating Citations (APA)* and *Creating Citations (MLA)*.

The *Creating Citations* workshops cover the basic elements of a citation, as well as NoodleTools, the Library's subscription-based online citation builder. With the addition of the *Creating Citations (Chicago/Turabian)* workshop, the Library now offers workshops on the three major citation styles used on campus.

*Primary/Secondary Sources* teaches

students to identify primary and secondary sources, as well as search techniques for locating them.

The Library offers over 50 workshops per semester covering seven different research topics: *Finding Articles*, *Credible Internet Sources*, *Literary Criticism Sources*, *Primary/Secondary Sources*, and *Creating Citations (APA, Chicago/Turabian, and MLA)*.

Advance online registration for the workshops is required. There is no charge for library workshops. Students receive verification of attendance at the end of each 30 minute workshop.

Consider requiring workshop attendance to improve student success.

## Bloom's Literature

This semester, the Library began a one-year trial of Bloom's Literature. This resource contains more than 20,000 critical essays from over 500 literary journals and 2,300 scholarly and critical books, including 700 titles published by *Bloom's Literary Criticism* and *Facts On File*. Also included
