SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION VERIFICATION

In order to receive Federal Student Aid, you must be registered with the Selective Service if you are a male who is 18 years old or more and born after December 31, 1959. Because the processor of your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) did not confirm that you registered with U. S. Selective Service System, you must now clear this up with the Santiago Canyon College (SCC) Financial Aid Office (FAO) before your student aid can be processed. Once you have registered with the Selective Service System, you may be awarded financial aid programs. For additional information regarding registering for Selective Service, you may call the Selective Service System at (847)688-6888.

CHECK THE BOX THAT APPLIES TO YOU AND PROVIDE PROOF OF SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION:

- If you are registered, **attach a photocopy of your Selective Service Registration Identification Card.**
- If you want to register yourself, contact the Selective Service Office by going to WWW.SSS.GOV and click "Register" (Instructions on page 2). **Attach a copy of your official Letter of Verification of Selective Service.**
- If you do not have your Selective Service Identification Card and have already registered, contact the Selective Service Office by going to WWW.SSS.GOV and click "Verify or Update Registration." **Attach a copy of your official Letter of Verification of Selective Service.**
- If you have not registered with the Selective Service System, the Department of Education (DOE) can register you. You will need to update your [FAFSA](#) by selecting "**Register me**" (Question #22). If you are not yet 18, you will be registered by your 18th birthday. **Attach a copy of the FAFSA Confirmation Page.**
- Exempt: I am female.
- Exempt: I am a transgender male who was assigned the sex of female at birth.
- Exempt: I was born before December 31, 1959.
- I am a Veteran who is 26 years of age or older and served on active duty in the armed forces, excluding reserve forces, National Guard or Delayed Entry pool. Attach a copy of the DD Form 214 "Certificate of Release of Discharge from Active Duty".
- I was 26 years of age or older when I entered the United States. Provide copies of your documentation, a copy of the I-94 card or the Alien registration card that indicates your date of entry to the United States.
- If you are unable to provide any of the information requested above, please attach a Status Information Letter from the Selective Service Office.** You can obtain this letter by going to the Selective Services website at www.sss.gov and clicking on "Request a *Status Information Letter*." You can also obtain this letter by the Selective Service System at (847)688-6888 Selective Service System, P.O. Box 94638, Palatine, IL 60094-4638 or. You will need to return it to the above address with a written statement including an explanation of noncompliance.

Certification and Signature: The student whose information was reported on the FAFSA must sign and date. The person signing below certifies that all of the information reported is complete and correct.

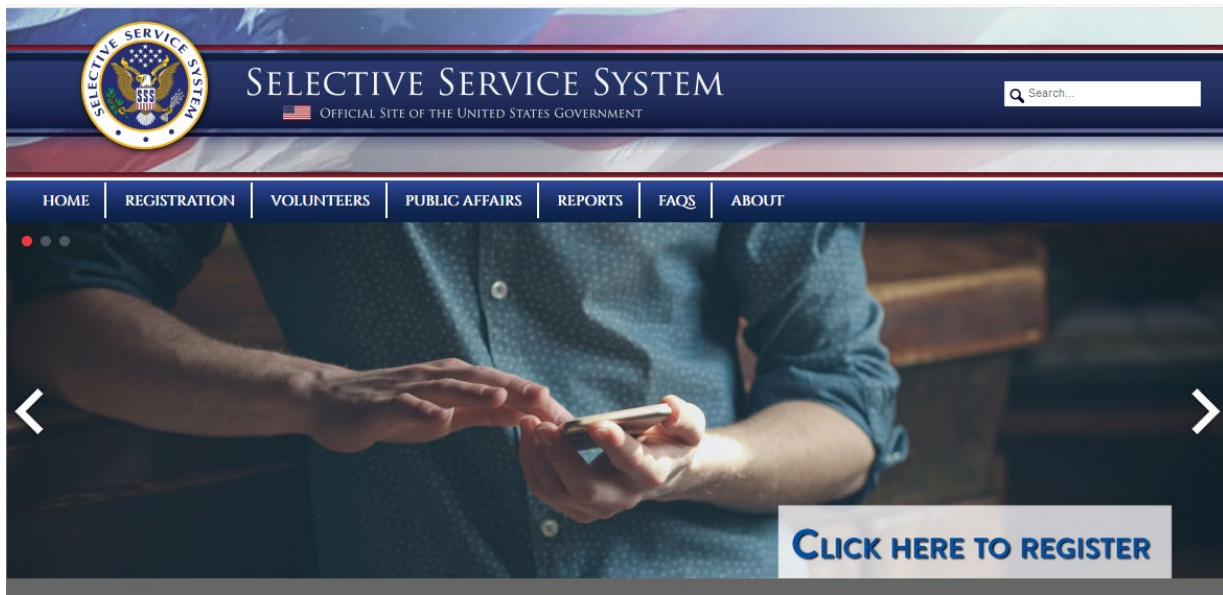

Selective Service Mission

To register men and maintain a system that, when authorized by the President and Congress, rapidly provides personnel in a fair and equitable manner while managing an alternative service program for conscientious objectors.

Step 2: Click “Register Online” and complete the registration form:

Register Now

Men living in the U.S., citizen and non-citizens alike, are required by law to register with Selective Service at 18 years old.

Men who register with Selective Service remain eligible for federal student financial aid, state-funded student financial aid, federal employment, state employment, job training under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, security clearances, and U.S. citizenship for immigrant men. For more information, see [Why Register](#). Selective Service accepts early registrations as young as 17 years and 3 months.

The Selective Service System has not now, or in the past, collected or shared any information which would indicate a man's immigration status, either documented or undocumented.

If you don't know your social security number or don't have one, print the [Form 1](#), complete, and mail it to the address on the form.

Warning about Submitting False or Improper Information

Intentional submission of false information using this Federal Government Internet website or purposefully submitting a registration for a man without his knowledge and consent is illegal. Persons found guilty of knowingly submitting fraudulent registration information may be prosecuted and, upon conviction, may be subject to a fine of not more than \$250,000 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 5 years.
