8.01 SSCCC Fall General Assembly Recap *Discussion*

- The representatives of ASG that attended SSCCC GA speak.
- Rachelle Rivera: First conference as a member of the ASG. Was able to learn about many diverse topics such as DACA and 9+1 rights.
- Mariam Azizi: First conference as the Delegate Elect. Being able to witness colleges voting on behalf of students from all over California was amazing. Looks forward to the next GA.
- Jessica Khalili: Will speak for herself and Delegate Vargas. The members who were going to GA has a meeting beforehand where the resolution packet was discussed. Enjoyed being a member of SSCCC as a Legislative Field Director. SSCCC will take the passed resolutions and the Directors such as LAD, SAD, and RAD will meet to prioritize passed resolution. Khalili will be focusing on Mental Health on behalf of region 8. There will be another GA during the spring semester where new resolutions will be brought forth that relate to students of California Community Colleges. Prior to this GA there was a large emphasis on students voting. Khalili is working on the Student Vote Project. The goal of the project is to increase student participation in all local, state, or federal elections. The project is nonpartisan and is simply intended to increase civic engagement in Community Colleges.
- Ed Hou: Enjoyed the opportunity to interact with student leaders from other Community Colleges. The process of voting and discussion on important matters is extremely important. There were breakout sessions about common problems that student leaders face across California. These sessions are extremely beneficial to gather further information or ideas towards pushing for student rights.

- Marsh: Create a plan or schedule for events and not dumping abnormal amount of work on people who are new or who did not hold the position they did in the pass.
- Byon: Refrain from using whatsapp as the official group message system for ASG. Members are irresponsible on the group chat. Suggest using facebook or some other medium.
- Ed Hou: Asks the council to take out paper and write down any and all ideas they have towards improving the school or events, policies, changes, or activism.
