Learned about current laws that affect us such as AB 705, which gives students the right to choose when to transfer level classes. One of the main parts of SSSCCC was to pass resolutions, 13/14 resolutions passes. The only one that did not pass was about a vote of no confidence towards the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges and the ability to implement ideas/laws on campus such as Guided Pathways which has no base guidelines, AB 705, and the Student Centered Funding Formula. Hoping to allocate more money for sustaining more library hours with the leverage from this fund.
