



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HOW TO APPLY AND REGISTER

STEP ONE:

To apply to Santiago Canyon College, if you did not attend TWO consecutive Full Semester terms (Fall AND Spring), complete an application online at sccollege.edu/apply. Click on the **APPLY** link. After submitting all of your information, you will receive an email confirmation from Open CCC. Within 1 business day, you will receive an email with your Single Sign-On login information. Within 3 business days, you will receive an email from Santiago Canyon College with orientation, course placement, and registration information. Your registration date will also be posted on Self-Service.

STEP TWO:

Online Records is open Monday–Sunday (24/7)

- 1 Go to sccollege.edu/selfservice
- 2 Log In with your single sign-on login and password
- 3 On the launch page, click on "Student Planning"
- 4 Type in the courses you want to enroll in under the "Search for courses" bar
- 5 Use filters on the left-hand side to filter to location to "Santiago Canyon College" and Terms to "Summer 2025"
- 6 Click on "View Available Sections for..." your course
- 7 When you find a section that you want, click on "Add Section to Schedule"
- 8 A "Section Details" prompt will appear, click "Add Section"
- 9 Do these steps for all of the courses you want to enroll in
- 10 Once you are done, navigate to "Plan & Schedule" under "Student Planning" from the left side menu.
- 11 Make sure you choose the correct term of "Summer 2025"
- 12 When you are on "Schedule" you will be able to view all the courses you selected
- 13 To register for the course, click "Register"

- You will lose registration priority if you are on academic probation or progress probation at the end of Fall 2024.
- You will lose registration priority if you have more than 100 degree applicable units

DROP FOR NON-PAYMENT POLICY

Enrollment fees must be paid IN FULL within 3 days of registration or all of your classes **may** be dropped and released to other students. The day you register is your first day. If you need assistance paying your enrollment fees and would like to apply for a the California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOG Fee Waiver), go to www.cccapply.org/money/california-college-promise-grant. It is your responsibility to check your account balance and pay the amount owed. As a general rule, Summer 2025 refunds would only be given if students drop on or before the first class meeting.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY TO DROP CLASSES

To avoid a "W" grade, students must drop classes on or before the day of the first class meeting. Students may not be automatically dropped for non-attendance once the summer session begins. You must drop online. After the first day of the first class meeting, you will not be eligible to receive a refund for your classes nor will you be exempt from enrollment fees. Check drop the date online or under section information on each course.

WAIT LIST POLICY

You are not able to wait list more than one section of the same course. You cannot Wait List a course that will conflict with another course. As seats become available, students will be moved into an open seat. **It is your responsibility to periodically check your class schedule online, or you may lose your place on the Wait List. You will have 3 days to pay for the course or you may be dropped.** If your name remains on the Wait List, you must attend the first class meeting and obtain an add authorization code from the instructor to add the course. You must add using Self-Service. Only the instructor can grant add authorizations.

PAY FEES IMMEDIATELY

- **Refunds:** Students will be eligible for a refund if they drop their course on or before the day of the first class meeting.
- **Pay Online via using Self-Service at sccollege.edu/SelfService or In Person** at the SCC Cashier's Office. Payment by check, Visa, MasterCard, AmEx, and Discover are accepted. (\$363.00 Tuition + \$49.00 Capital Outlay)
- Required of all out-of-state residents (students who have not resided in the State of California for one year), International and non-citizen students. These fees are in addition to the \$46.00 per unit enrollment fee. Questions regarding residency determination may be referred to the Admissions and Records Office.

- **Material Fee:** Material fee may be required for a course. Check classes online for specific fees.
- **Parking Permit Fee:** \$10.00
Required for all vehicles parking on campus. Motorcycles are exempt in designated areas.

ACCOUNTING (ACCT)

ACCT 101, FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING

4.0 UNITS

The study of accounting as an information system, examining why it is important, and how it is used by investors and creditors to make decisions. Coverage includes the accounting information system and the recording and reporting of business transactions with a focus on the accounting cycle, the application of generally accepted accounting principles, the classified financial statements, and statement analysis. It also includes issues relating to asset, liability, and equity valuation, revenue and expense recognition, cash flow, internal controls and ethics.

ACCT 102, MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTING

4.0 UNITS

Study of the use and reporting of accounting data for managerial planning, cost control, and decision-making purposes. The course includes broad coverage of concepts, classifications, and behaviors of costs. Topics include cost systems, the analysis and use of cost information, cost-volume-profit analysis, contribution margin, profit planning, standard costs, relevant costs, and capital budgeting.

3.0 UNITS

Presents the theory of cost behavior, cost accounting, and cost control; the use of accounting information for management planning and decision making; cost systems, budgeting, and financial performance analysis.

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (ASL)

ASL 110, AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE I

4.0 UNITS

This entry-level course is designed to introduce students to American Sign Language (ASL) and fingerspelling as it is used within American Deaf culture. Instruction includes preparation for visual/gestural communication followed by intensive work on comprehension through receptive language skills, development of basic conversational skills, modeling of grammatical structures, and general information about American Deaf culture. American Sign Language 110 is equivalent to two years of high school ASL. Students are required to attend at least one off-campus event.

ANTHROPOLOGY (ANTH)

ANTH 100, INTRODUCTION TO CULTURAL ANTHROPOLOGY

3.0 UNITS

A cross-cultural survey of the major areas of cultural anthropology including subsistence patterns, economic and political systems, family and kinship, religion, and cultural change. Also includes contemporary issues facing humankind such as the environment, resource depletion, ethnic conflict, globalization, and warfare. Emphasis is on understanding cultural diversity and cultural universals.

ANTH 101, INTRODUCTION TO PHYSICAL ANTHROPOLOGY

3.0 UNITS

An introduction to humankind's place in nature, including evolutionary theory, principles of genetics, primate evolution and behavior, fossil evidence for human evolution, human biology and variation, growth and adaptability, and biomedical anthropology. Includes practical application of biological anthropology to human problems. Field trips may be required.

ART 100, INTRODUCTION TO ART CONCEPTS

3.0 UNITS

A study of the visual arts in relation to both personal and cultural expressions. Fundamentals of visual organization, color theory, terminology, historical art movements and concepts will be studied. Students are required to visit an art museum during the semester. Required for art majors.

3.0 UNITS

Enriched exposure to a study of the visual arts in relation to personal and cultural expression with an emphasis on critical thinking and writing. Fundamentals of visual organization, color theory, terminology, historical art movements and concepts will be studied in a seminar format. Students are required to visit an art museum or gallery.

ASTR 102, INTRODUCTION TO STARS AND GALAXIES

3.0 UNITS

Surveys the development of astronomy, current research and observations of stars, galaxies and large-scaled structures in the universe. Explores light and gravity to understand the properties and evolution of stars, neutron stars, black holes, galaxies and the universe structures and changes.

Principles of biology stressing the relationship of all organisms from anatomical, physiological and ecological points of view. Includes cell machinery, genetics, reproduction, embryology, animal behavior, botany, ecology, evolution and human physiology. Designed for non-biology majors.

4.0 UNITS

This course covers basic concepts of marine ecosystems including oceanographic principles, ecology, and a survey of marine habitats and diversity of marine organisms. Field trips required.

BIOL 139, HEALTH MICROBIOLOGY

4.0 UNITS

Presents practical and theoretical aspects of medical microbiology to meet the needs of those in allied health professions. Provides basic knowledge of the microbial world by covering diversity, structure, metabolic and genetic characteristics, cultivation and control. Emphasis is placed on human-microbe interactions especially infectious diseases. Laboratory deals with identification, growth, and control of microorganisms. Field trips may be required.

BIOL 197, SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATHEMATICS (STEM) INTERNSHIP

1.0 - 4.0 UNITS

This is an Internship of supervised paid or unpaid work experience in the student's major which could include new or expanded responsibilities. 75 hours paid work or 60 hours of unpaid work equals one unit. A maximum of 4 units is allowed per semester. Limitation of 16 units in occupational cooperative education courses.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of 10 units within the Biotechnology Program.

Designed for students transferring to a university.

4.0 UNITS

This course prepares students for Biology and Chemistry 200 by exploring the basic concepts of matter such as: atomic structure, formulas, equation writing, nomenclature, gases, and kinetic theory. Properties of solutions and the mole concept in quantitative chemistry will be emphasized.

CHEM 200A, GENERAL CHEMISTRY A

5.0 UNITS

This is the first semester of a year-long sequence covering the fundamental principles and concepts of chemistry and is intended for students studying physical science, life science, and engineering. The topics are to include, but not limited to, atomic structure, quantum theory, periodic properties, stoichiometry, oxidation-reduction, molecular structure and bonding, gas laws, states of matter, solutions, chemical kinetics and chemical equilibrium. This course is a requirement to earn a degree in the physical science, life science, and engineering majors.



Ramirez Library provides computer (PC/MAC) access to currently enrolled students, in addition to an ADA workstation, phone charging lockers, scanner, and black and white and color printing.
