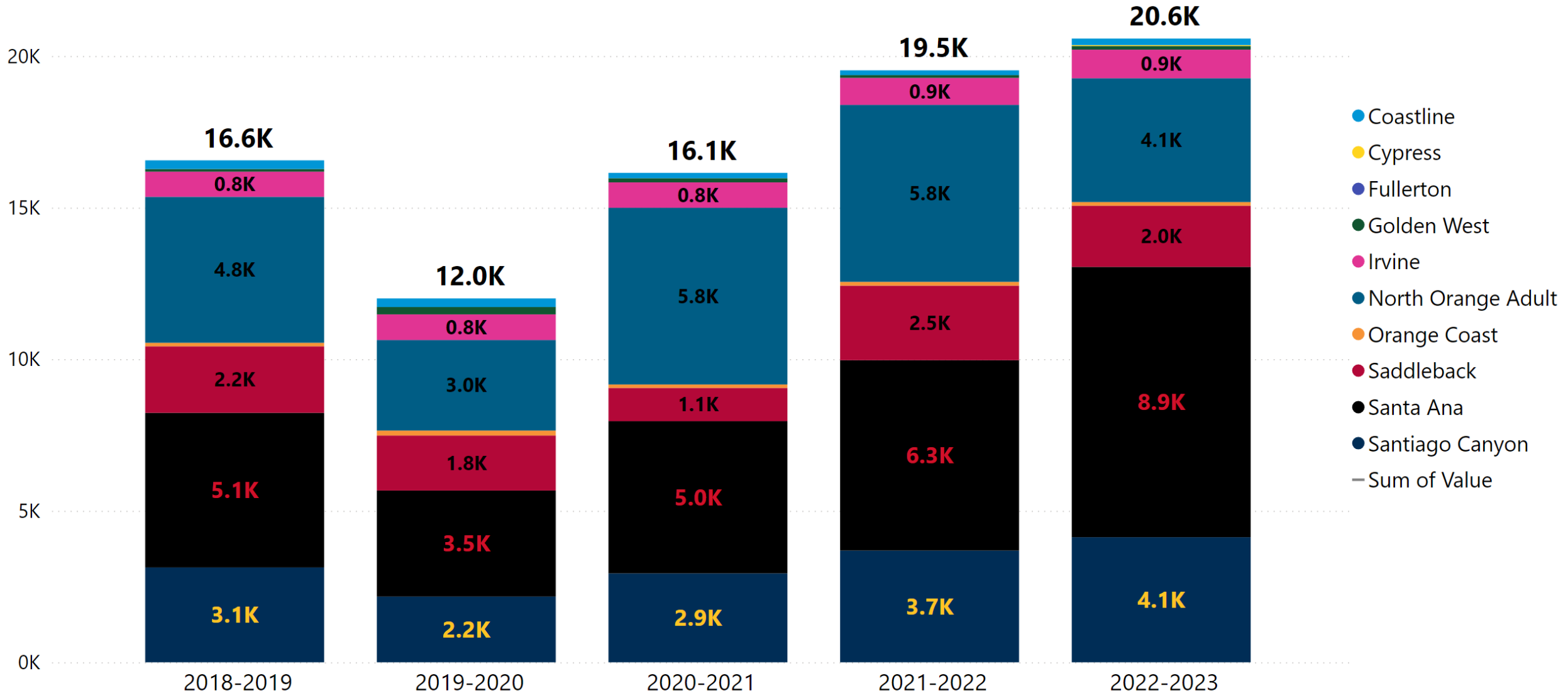
5YR Total FTES Comparison of OC Colleges



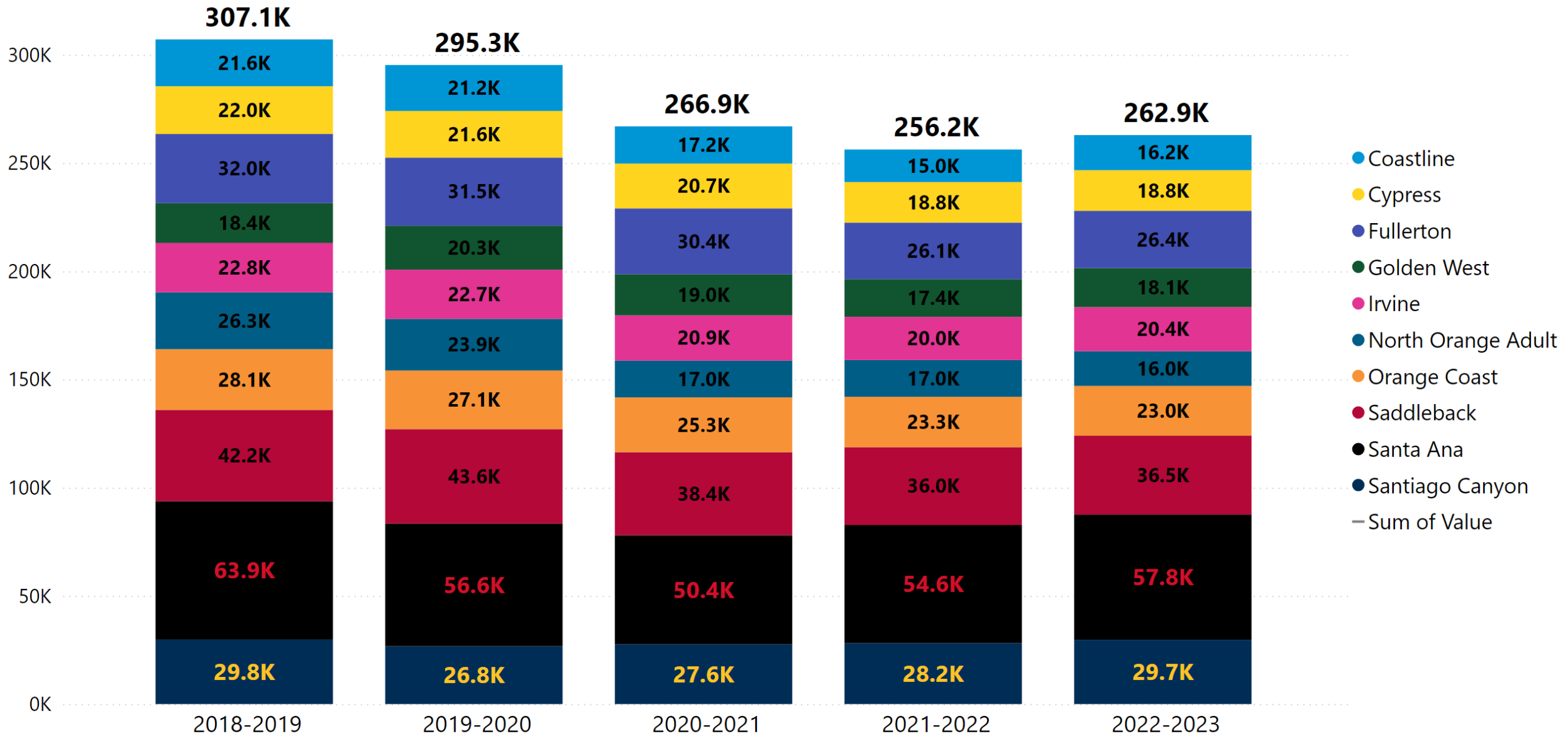
5YR Credit FTES Comparison of OC Colleges



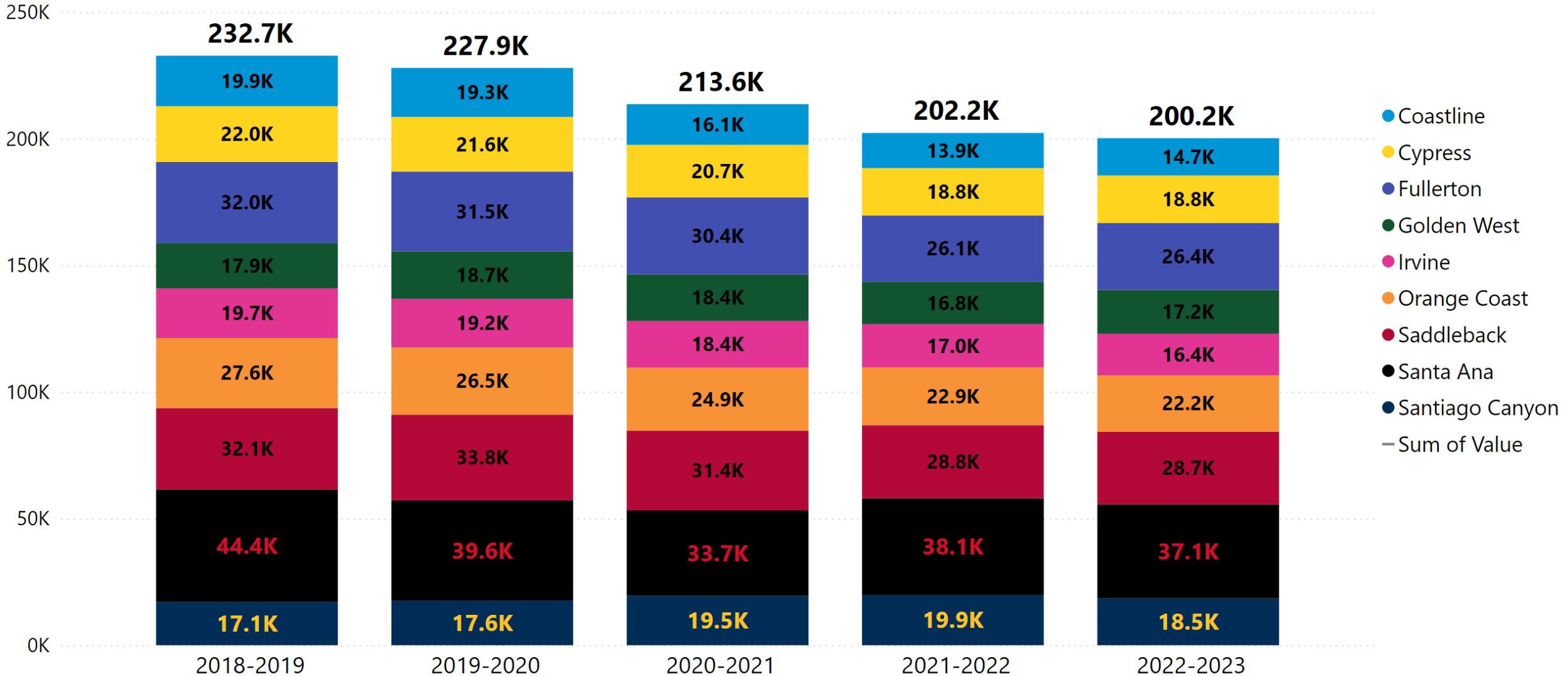
5YR NonCredit FTES Comparison of OC Colleges



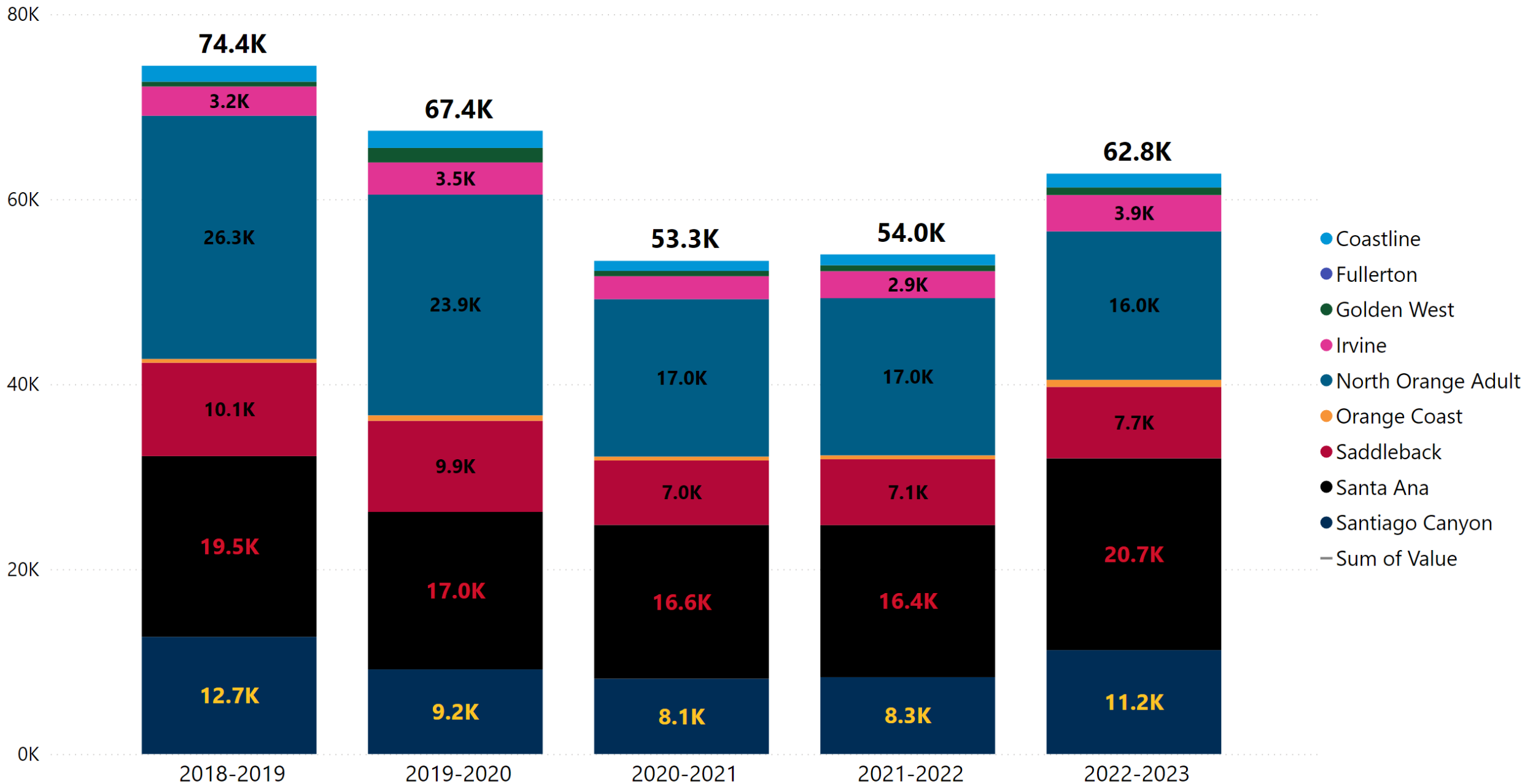
Total Unduplicated Headcount Comparison of OC Colleges



5YR Unduplicated Credit Headcount Comparison of OC Colleges



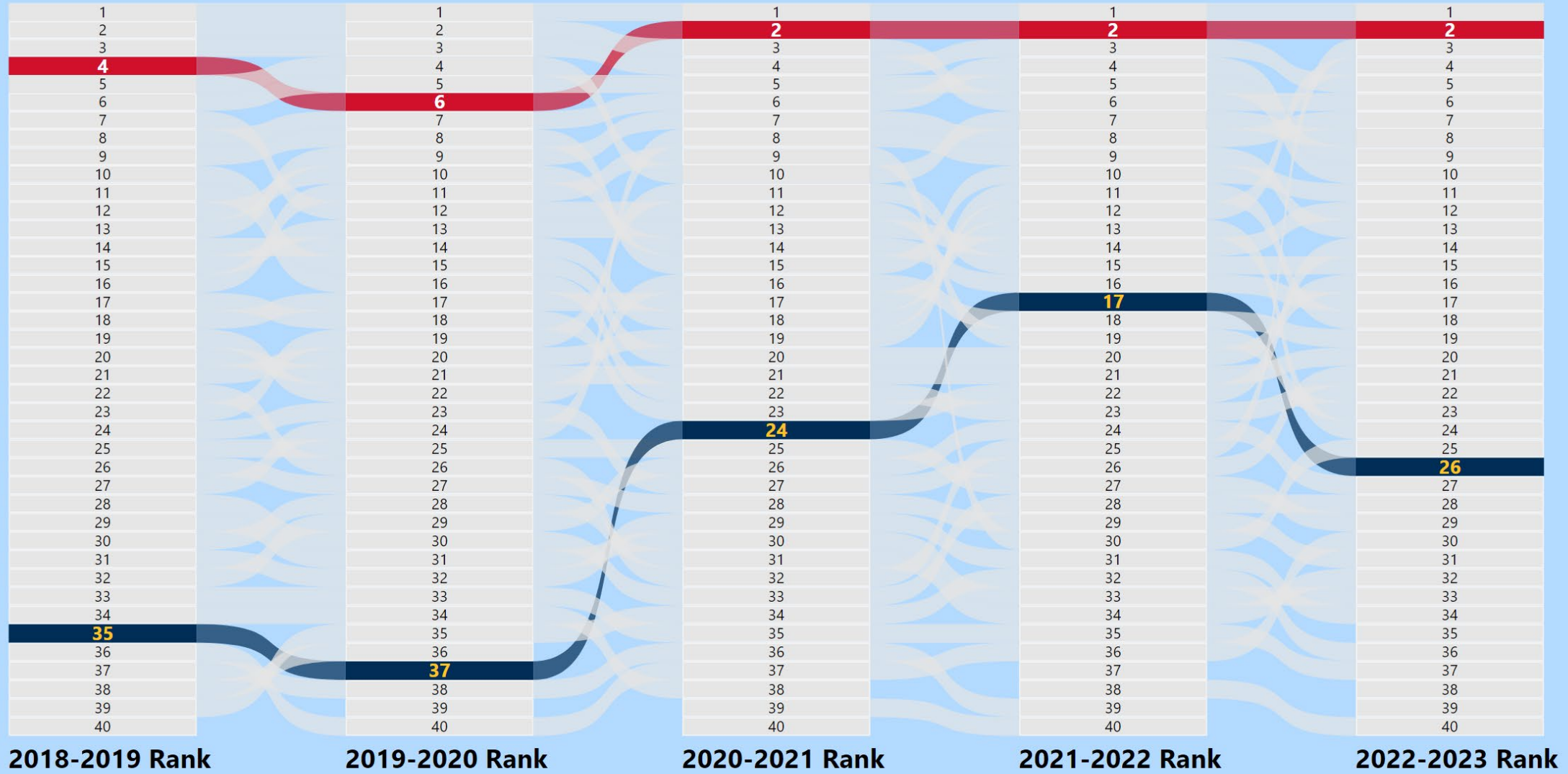

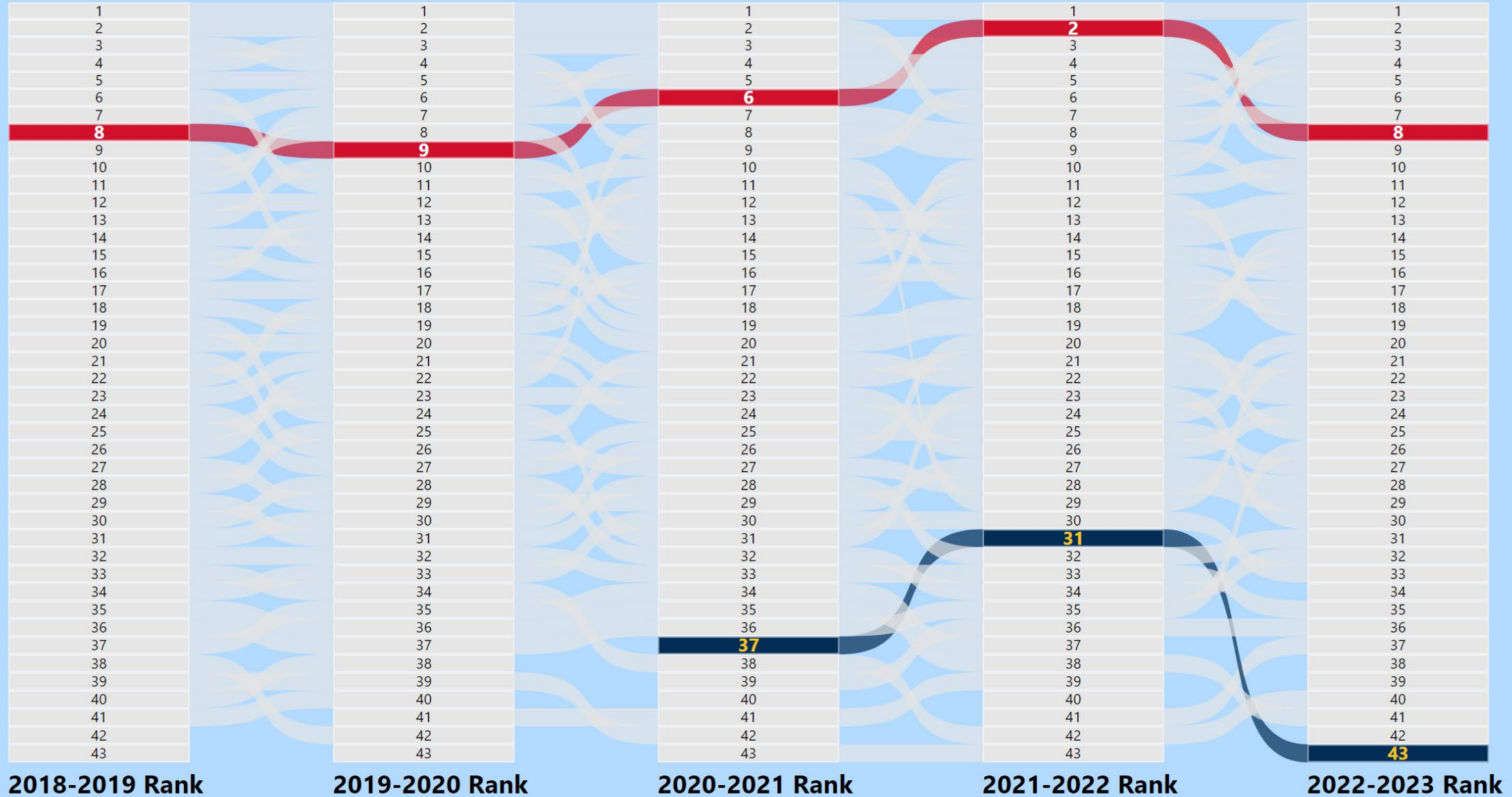

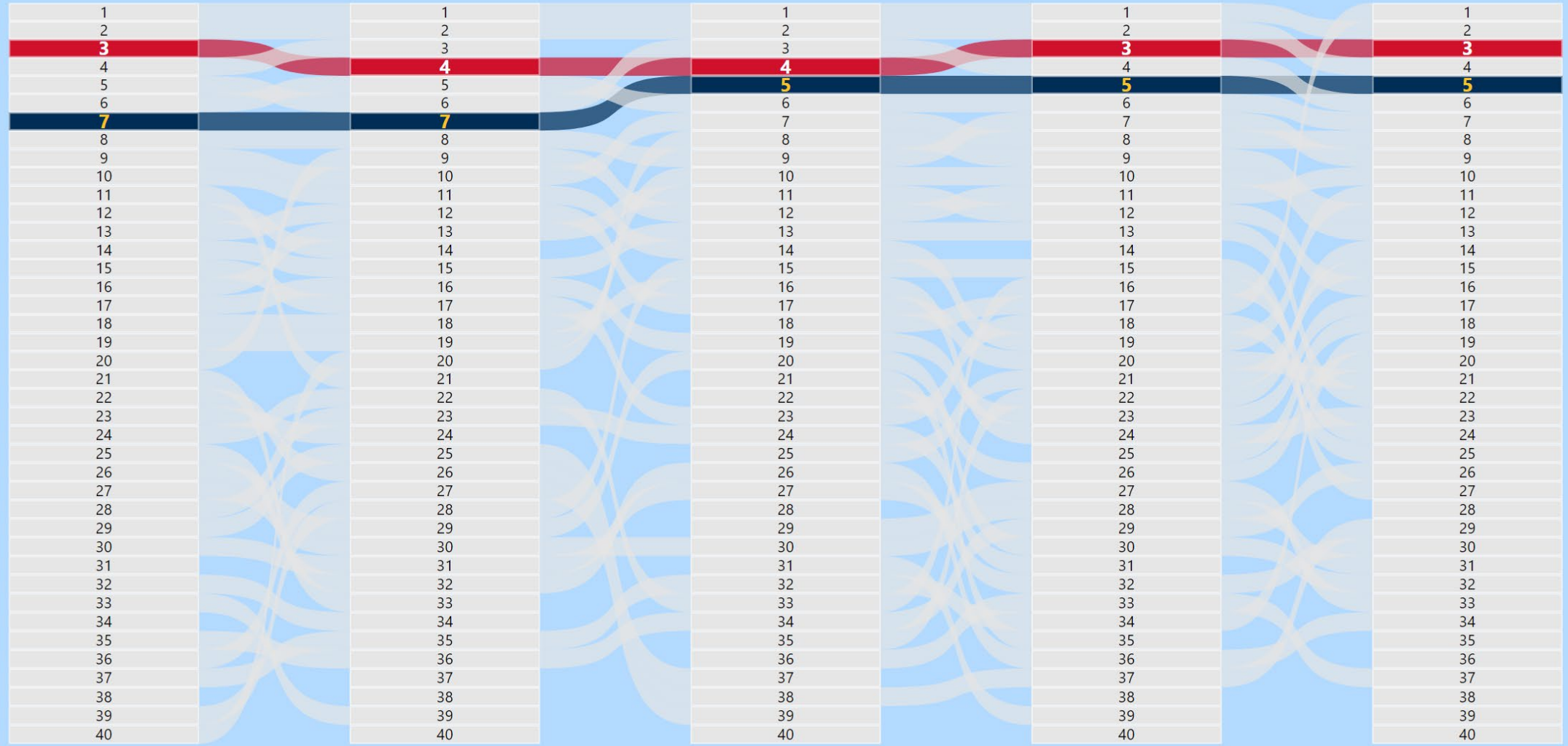

2019-20 and 2023-24 Enrollment in CA

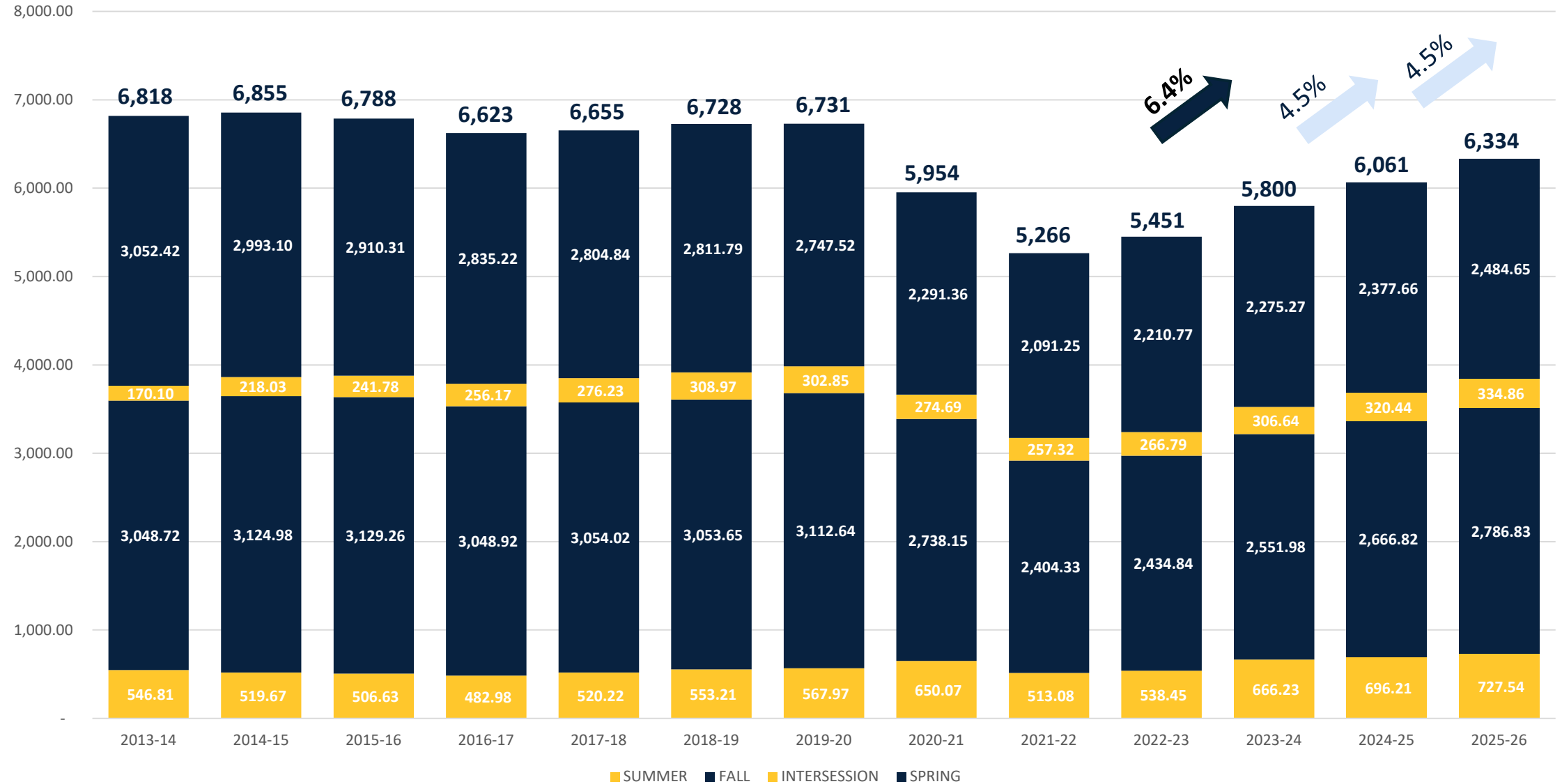

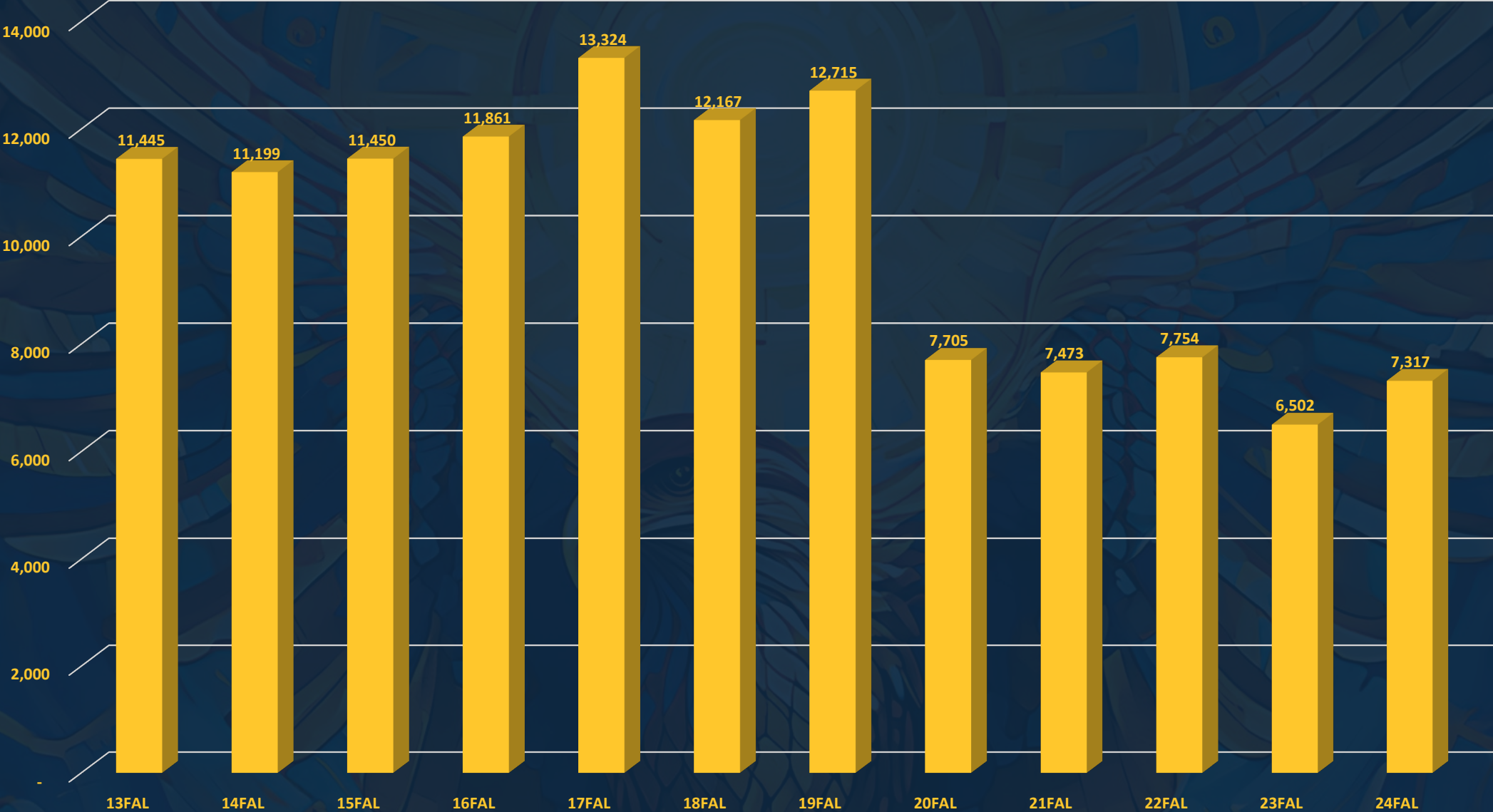
13 Year View of SCC Credit FTES



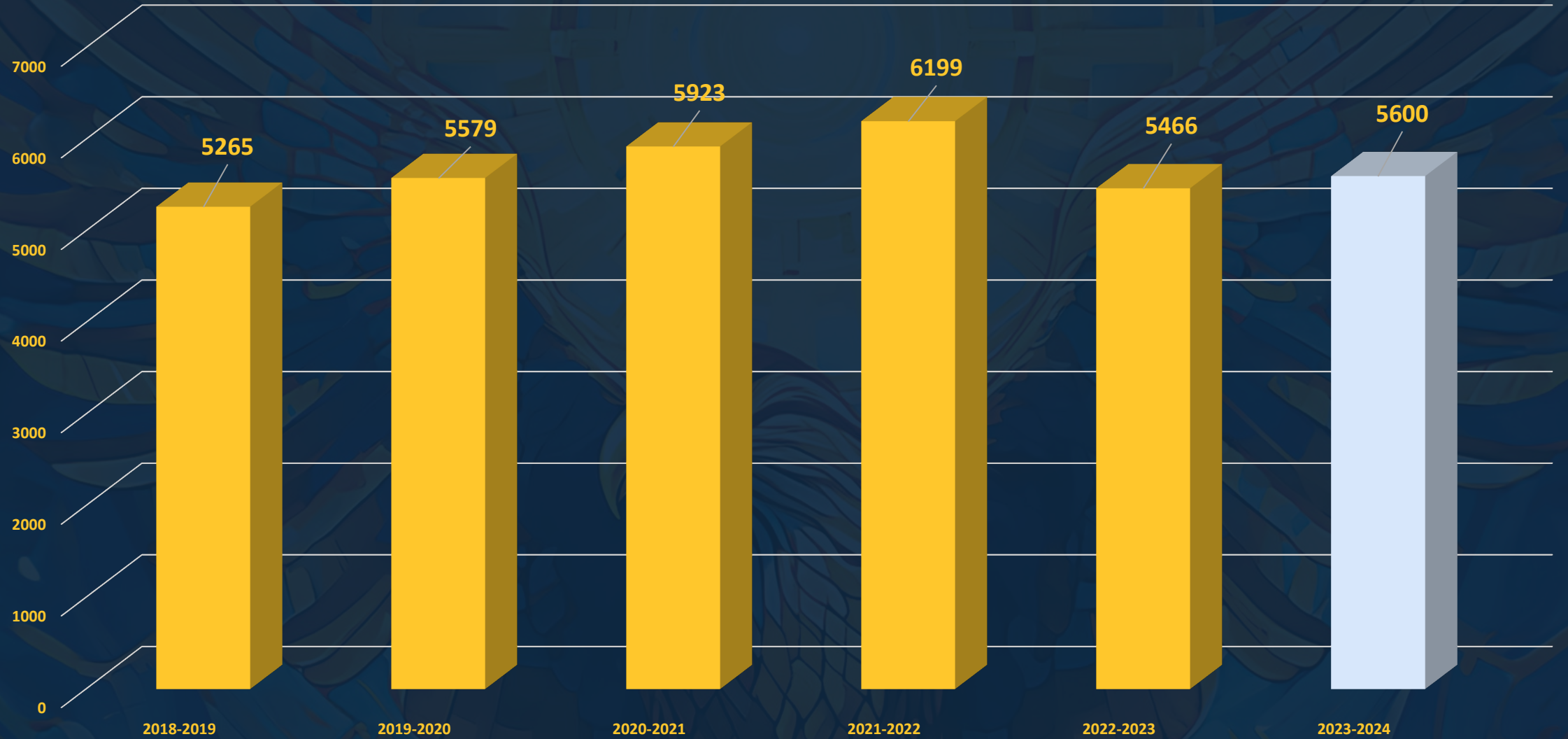

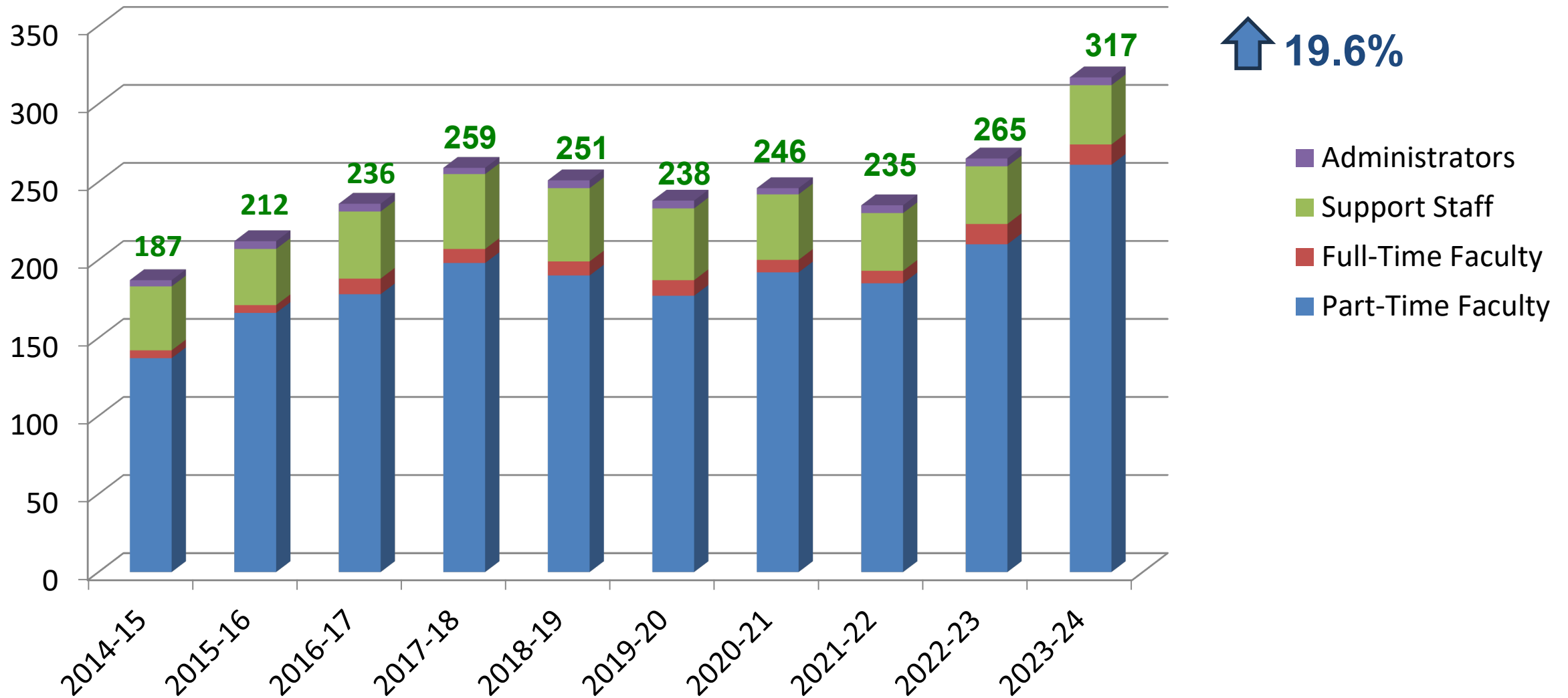


Students who Transferred to Credit Program



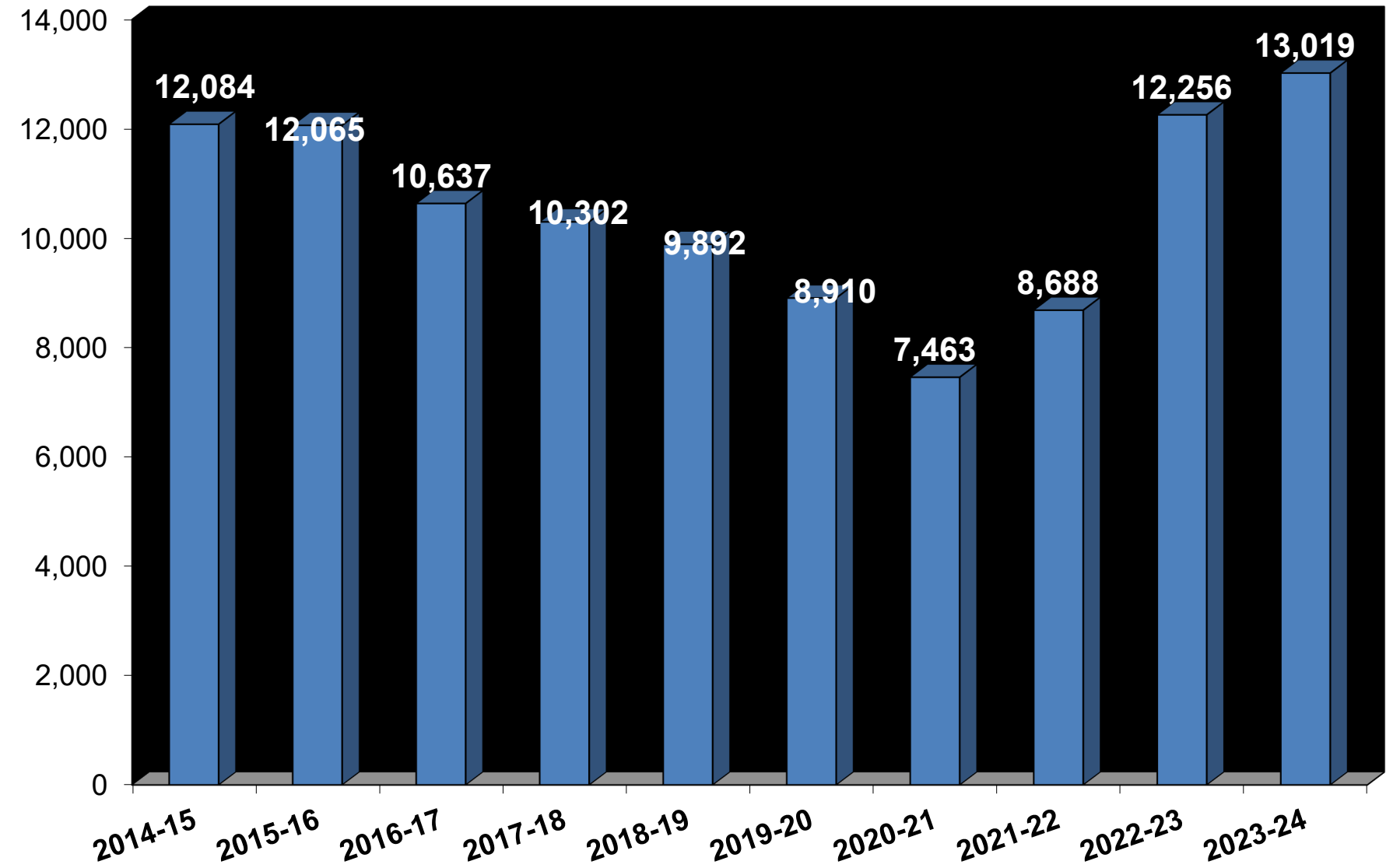

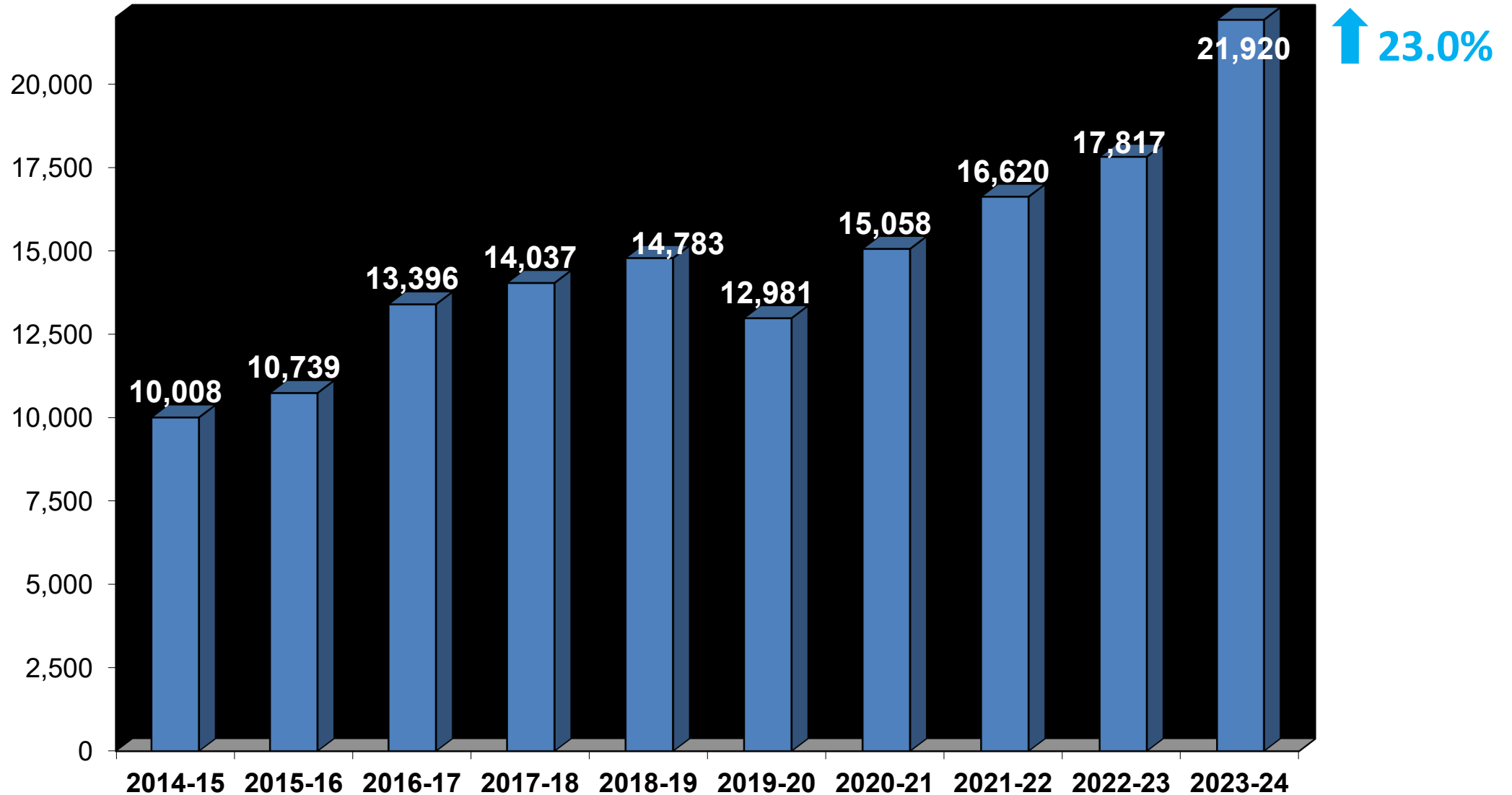
2024/2025 SUMMER POINT-IN-TIME COMPARISON BY PROGRAM 8/9/2023 VS 8/7/2024

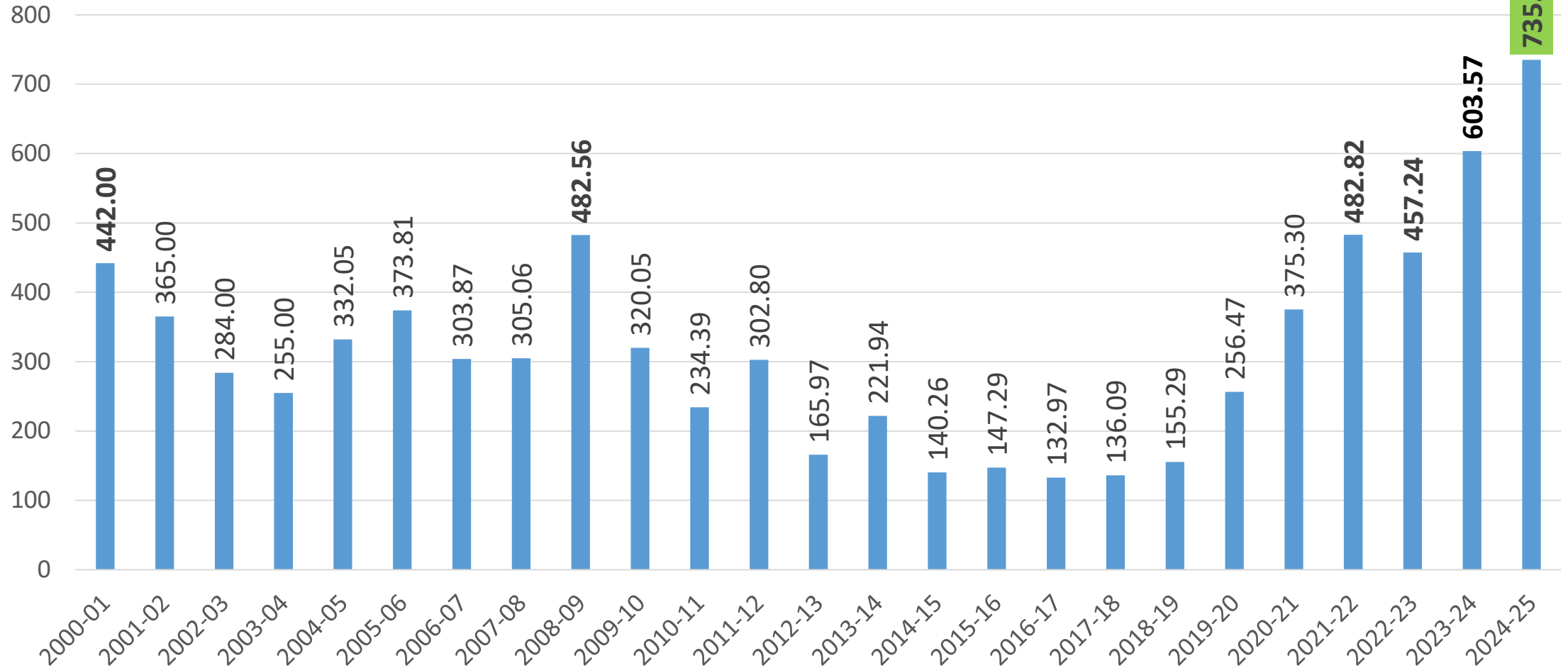

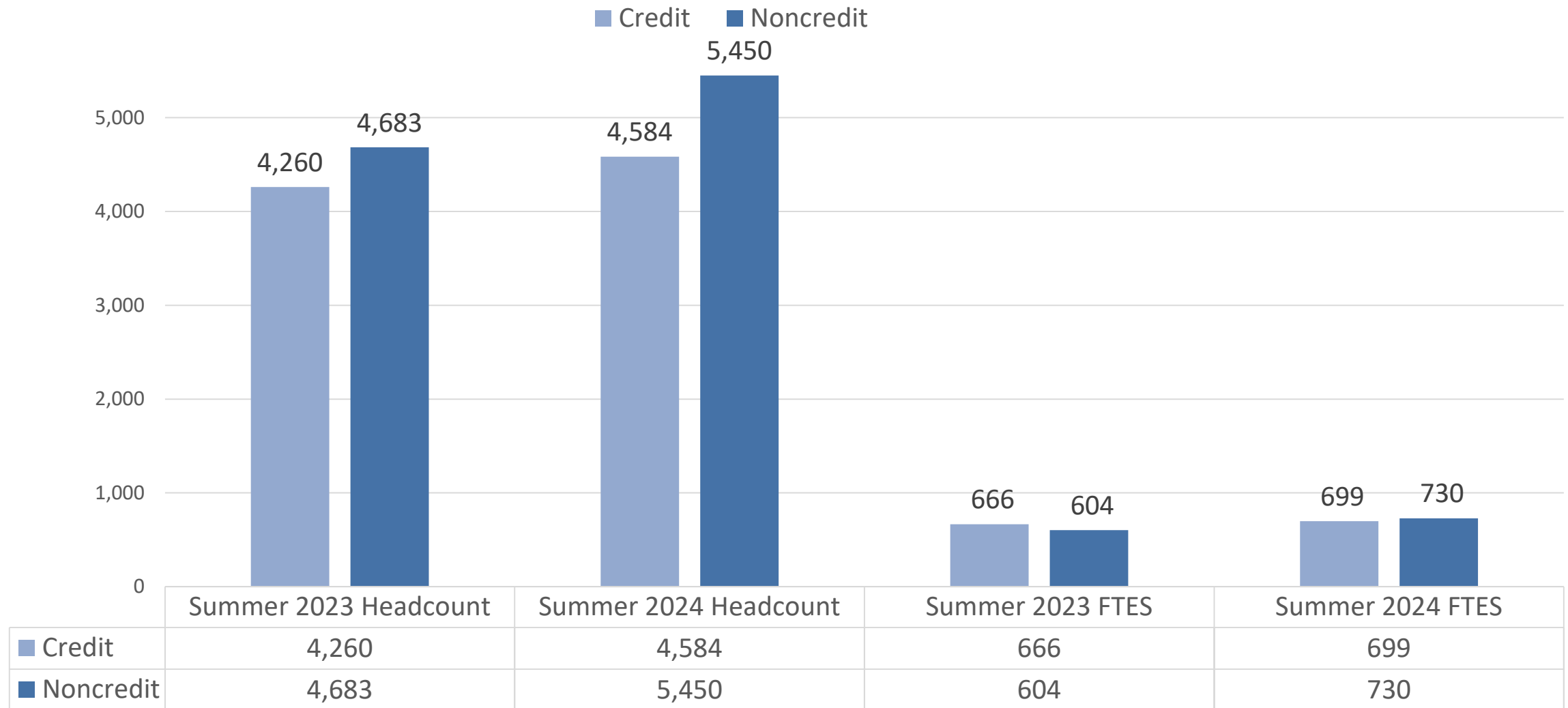
Summer NC FTES: Historical 2000-01 through 2024-25

What are food scraps?



Food scraps include all types of food including meat, dairy, seafood, fruits, vegetables, coffee grounds, etc.

PLEASE DO NOT INCLUDE NON-FOOD ITEMS, ESPECIALLY GLASS AND CLEANING CHEMICALS.

Food Scrap Recycling is Easy! Just follow these simple steps:

- 1) Separate food scraps: Place food scraps in the designated bin for collecting ONLY food scraps. Talk to your manager to be sure you know where all food scrap containers are located.
- 2) When internal food scrap collection receptacle is full, tie off compostable plastic liner and place into designated external food scrap collection container. All food scraps collected in this program will be processed to produce compost!
