



Student Annual Title IX Notice & Required Training

SCC, as part of the Rancho Santiago Community College District, is committed to providing a safe and inclusive environment free from gender or sex-based discrimination for its employees and students. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and other federal and state laws prohibit discrimination based on gender or sex in employment and all education programs and activities operated by the District. Under Title IX, discrimination based on sex can include sexual harassment, sexual misconduct, dating/domestic violence, retaliation, and stalking.

Required Training

Assembly Bill 2683 requires all students to (1) be trained on sexual violence and sexual harassment and (2) self-certify that they have completed their annual training within six months of the beginning of the academic year.
