CSU campuses have the discretion to allow courses used to satisfy the CSU U.S. History, Constitution, and AI graduation requirement to count for GE.

UC may require students to meet (some) AI graduation requirements if the student did not graduate from a high school in California. May be completed prior to transfer.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND FOOTNOTES

Requirements are subject to change. Please work with an SCC counselor to develop a Student Educational Plan (SEP) that includes major preparation.

- All courses completed on Cal-GETC must have a "C" or better grade to meet all areas. A C minus (C-) grade is NOT acceptable on Cal-GETC.
- Each course for Cal-GETC must have a minimum value of 3 semester or 4-quarter units.
- For a course to meet a requirement for Cal-GETC, students must ensure that the course is listed on the Cal-GETC list at the time of enrollment.
- Students who completed IGETC-approved courses prior to Fall 2025, including courses that are no longer active in assist.org, may apply those courses in the same Cal-GETC area for certification. For Example: SCC's Communication Studies 100/100H, 101, 110, COMM 111 and SAC's Communication Studies 100, 102/102H, 103/103H, 140, 145, or 150 are on the 2024-2025 IGETC. A student who completed any of the communication studies courses listed above prior to Fall 2025 can use the course to meet Cal-GETC Area 1C. Always reference ASSIST.org or meet with a counselor to confirm information.
- Courses with an asterisk, plus, or diamond sign (*/+/0) indicate one of the following credit limitation reasons:
 - *Sequential courses in Mathematics, Biological Sciences, and Foreign Languages will receive No Credit for an introductory course taken after the advanced course (Example: MATH 185 is taken first and then MATH 180 is taken, UCs will not grant credit for MATH 180, because it was completed after the advanced course MATH 185; it is out of sequence).
 - *Credit may be limited for courses with overlapping content (Example: CDEV 107 and PSYC 157 or SOC 240 and PSYC 240).
 - *Duplicate credit will not be awarded for both an Honors and non-Honors course (Example: HIST 101* and HIST 101H*)
 - + Courses with a plus sign are published in more than one GE area, but can only meet one GE area, not both. Exceptions are made for courses *in the sciences (5A/5B) and laboratory (5C); and courses that meet the CSU United States History, Constitution, and American Ideals graduation requirement, US1, and US2 + US3.*
 - ◇ Cross-listed course, credit will be given for only one course (Example: CDEV 107 and APCD 107 or ETHN 101 and SOC 101).
- Courses taken at regionally accredited colleges or universities (not at a California Community College) can meet Cal-GETC general education requirements. The Articulation Officer reviews such courses via the "Pass Along Petition" process. Per Cal-GETC general education standards, the Articulation Officer determines Cal-GETC GE placement. **Meet with an SCC counselor for more information on the Pass Along Petition process.**
