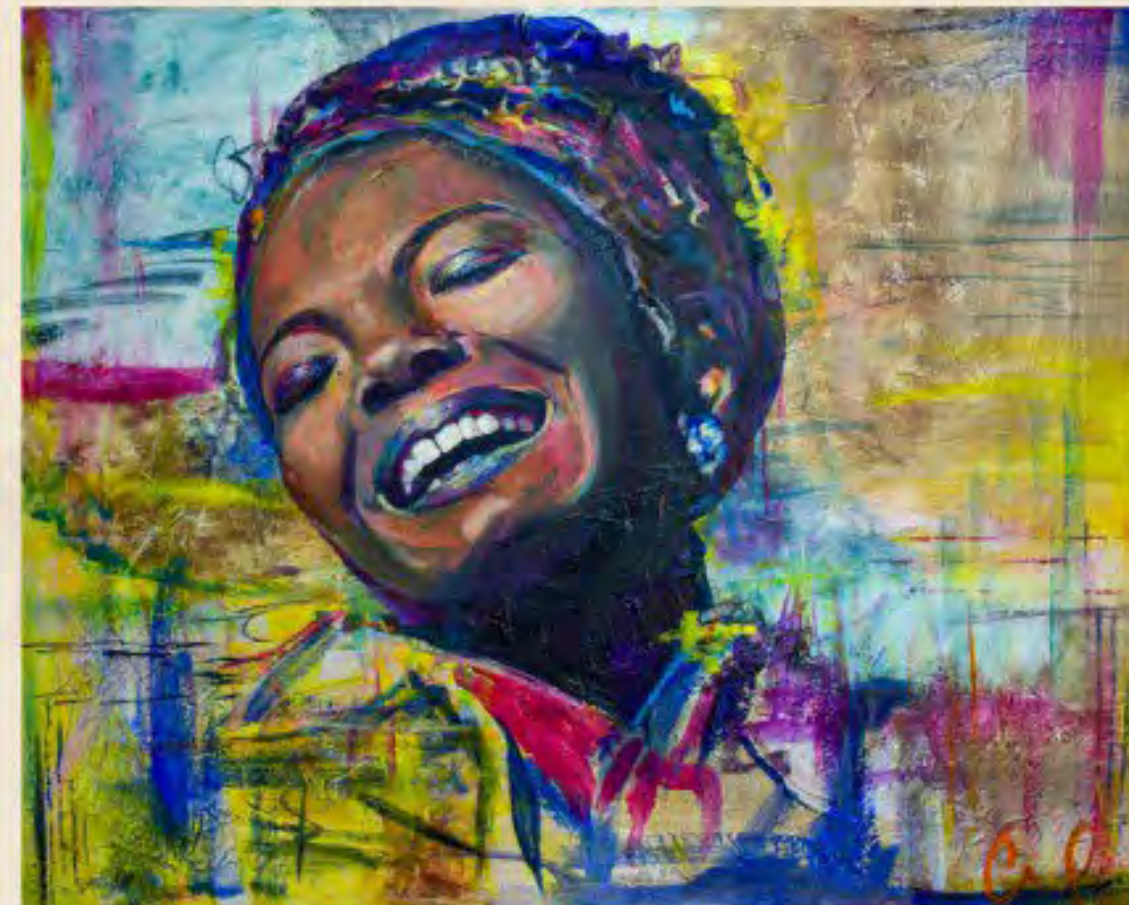

New Math Placement Process

- AB 1705 requires direct placement into transfer-level coursework for all students.
- Transfer-level course placement determined by high school coursework, GPA, and chosen pathway/major.
- Direct placement into transfer-level courses increases success and completion rates by decreasing the number of exit points.

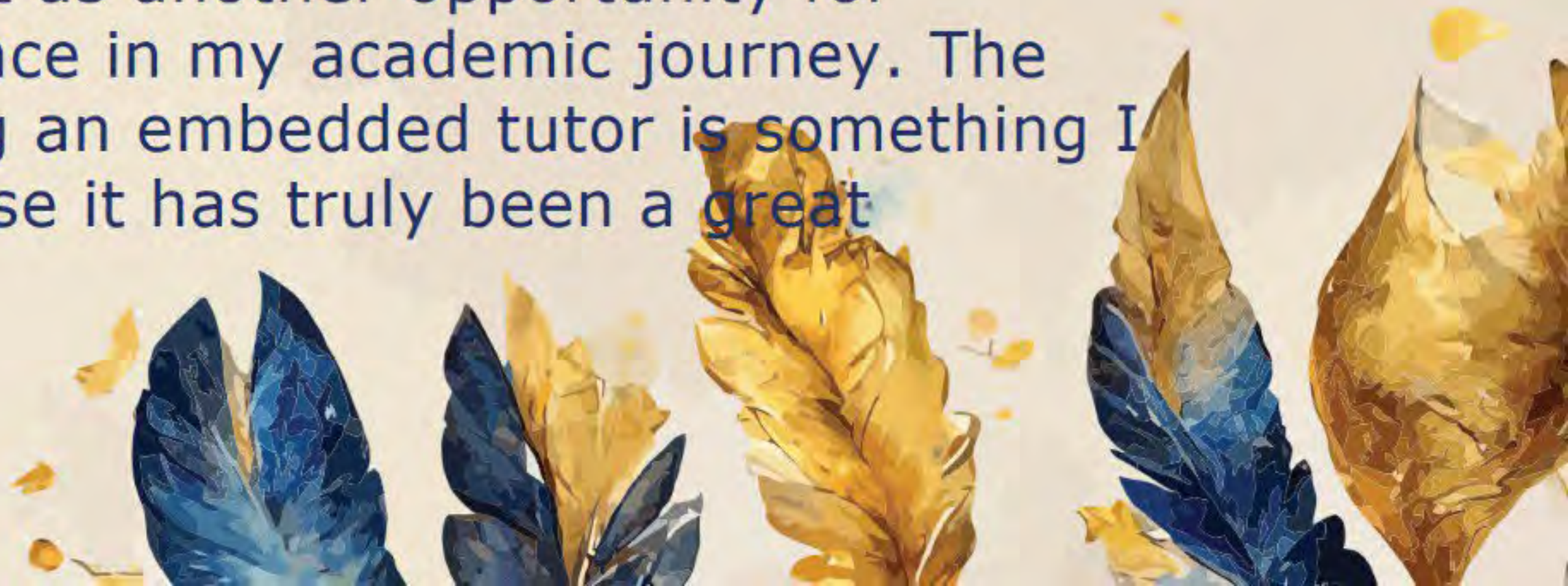

Overview

Dual enrollment is an evidence-based practice that has positive impacts on student outcomes if implemented *thoughtfully, intentionally, and equitably*, the benefits to students' college and career pathways can be significant (Taylor et al., 2022).



Dual Enrollment is part of the College Prep Ecosystem



Benefits of Early College (dual enrollment) programs

Benefits for students

- Explore career interests that USD may not offer
- Jumpstart for college while in high school (saving time and money)
- Access to SCC academic resources, clubs & events
- Seamless transition from high school to community college for career education or general education transfer
- Helps high school students achieve college and career readiness

Benefits for unified school districts

- Better outcomes for state “college and career readiness” indicators
- Offer students unique college experience at their high school campus
- Intentional alignment of pathways can lead to students obtaining Associate Degrees and Certificates from the college
- Prepare at-risk students and those who struggle academically
- Improve high school graduation rate & baccalaureate obtainment

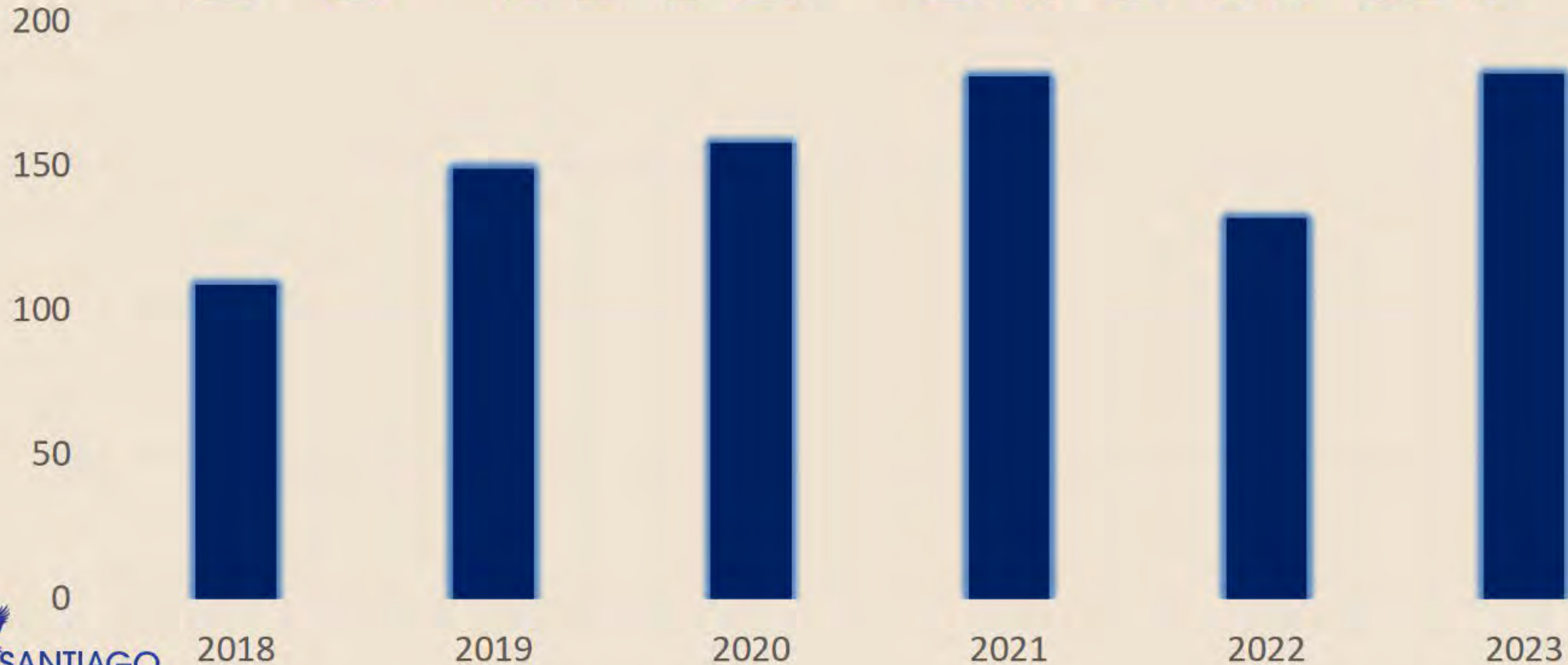
